

## Regulatory Permits



### Chemical Applications

#### What can I do with a DNR permit?

- ◆ Cost is \$24.50 annually. *January – December*
- ◆ Chemical applications may be performed. *A majority of the applications of chemicals need to be performed by licensed applicators. DNR staff supervision may also be required.*
- ◆ May take up to 2 weeks to obtain paper copy although online tracking is available and copy can be printed usually within 5-7 business days.
- ◆ Do you need WPDES (Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) coverage? Wisconsin Lake & Pond Resource has blanket coverage so you would not need to apply.
- ◆ Section NR 205.08, Wis. Adm. Code, contains further requirements concerning the issuance of general permits. See Pesticide Pollutant Discharge for Control of Aquatic Plants, Algae, and Bacteria (WI-0064556)
- ◆ Common permit holders include, but are not specific to, municipalities, HOA's, cities, golf courses, campgrounds, corporations.
- ◆ Product applications only; does not offer fishing or stocking opportunities.

#### What can I do with a WDATCP Fish Farm Registration?

**Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection** ~ *Working for You All Day Every Day*

- ◆ Cost is \$37.50 per year. Expires March 31<sup>st</sup> of each year.
- ◆ Property owner may fish in the pond without obtaining a fishing license.
- ◆ Chemical applications may be performed. *A majority of the applications of chemicals need to be performed by licensed applicators.*
- ◆ Fish may be stocked without further licensing.
- ◆ May take up to three (3) weeks to obtain.
- ◆ Common registrants include, but are not limited to, property owners, campgrounds, HOA's.

### Fish Stocking

Wisconsin DNR requires anyone without a WDATCP Fish Farm Registration to obtain a one-time stocking permit in order to stock fish. This can easily be obtained with the help of the hatchery as fish certification is also required on the application.

### Construction

Wisconsin State Law requires a person to obtain a permit if they plan to construct, dredge, or enlarge a pond or artificial waterbody when certain conditions exist. Some waterways have special designations that might affect your permit requirements. Local permits and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regulations may also apply.
